
We Must Create a New Reality

The divergence in median net wealth runs throughout racial and ethnic groups.

The Racial Wealth Gap



Whites inherit generational wealth at **3x** the rate of Blacks.

Whites are **88%** more likely than Blacks to hold six months of emergency savings.

Whites participate in workforce retirement plans at a **55%** higher rate than Latinos.

Inequality Holds Everyone Back

Financial disparities have cost the U.S. an estimated \$16 trillion in economic output since 2000.²

Financial Education for Black Women

We are continuing to create initiatives to empower Black women as community and cultural gatekeepers and entrepreneurial drivers, including a **first-of-its-kind research study** on how to build more trust between Black women and the financial services industry.





Recruiting and Training for Black Professionals

We believe in a holistic model that promotes corporate culture and maps out a path to career success that includes scholarships for current and future Black professionals, inclusive study group opportunities, and events such as our **Conference of African American Financial Professionals** (CAAFP).

Executive Leadership Programs for Black Leaders

We are working to give Black managers the chance to show their worth to the organization, enabling them to climb the ranks into executive roles through initiatives like our **Black Executive Leadership Program**®: a carefully-crafted, culturally-relevant, and customized program aimed at preparing the next generation of Black leaders in financial services.
